Ak vyjadrujeme budúcnosť po slove **when** (vo význame keď) použijeme vo vete prítomný čas.

When I have time, I will call you. (Keď budem mať čas, zavolám ti.)

When I go there, I will get it. (Keď tam pôjdem, kúpim to.)

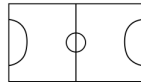
going to go = gonna go

V hovorovej angličtine sa môžeme často stretnúť so skráteným tvarom, **gonna** namiesto **going to**.

I am **going to eat**. = I'm **gonna eat**.

pitch = ihrisko

a football pitch, a hockey pitch, a quidditch pitch



change = prezliecť sa

I have got to go home and **change**. (Musím ísť domov a prezliecť sa.)

'We'll be there **in a bit**,' Harry assured her.

'Ron's just got to have some breakfast.'



in a bit = o chvíľu

I'll see you **in a bit**. (Uvidíme sa o chvíľu.)

Možno ste sa už stretli s výrazmi **must** a **have to** vo význame musieť.

Dnes si uvedieme ďalší a to "have got to"

I have got to do something. (I've got to do something.)

He has got to do something. (He's got to do something.)

I have got to help her. = **I've got to help her**. (Musím jej pomôcť.)

It became clear after ten minutes, however, that Ron was not **capable of** eating anything more and Harry thought it best to get him down to the **changing rooms**.

capable = schopný

ak po **capable** nasleduje sloveso dáme ho do **-ing tvaru**

I was **capable of reading** this book in 2 days. (capable of + reading)

(Bola som schopná prečítať túto knihu za 2 dni.)
